Nomination Criteria:

- 10 years or more of dedicated service and commitment to the seniors housing sector with a majority focus on retirement living.
- Proven ability to move groups of diverse people and organizations towards a common goal for the betterment of the retirement community sector.
- Demonstrated achievements designed to leave a lasting legacy and impact on the retirement community sector.
- Gained respect of peers, government officials, and community liaison groups.
- Provided inspiration and illustrated personal integrity.
- Actively volunteered their time to the Association on behalf of an organization that has maintained an active ORCA Membership.

Nomination Guidelines:

Nominee must be from the sector – working/retired/volunteer/posthumously.

- More than one person may be nominated from the same organization.
- Nomination must be from an ORCA member and cannot be a relative.
- Nominees who are unsuccessful this year may be re-submitted the following year without additional paperwork at the nominator's discretion.

Submission:

- New this year: the nomination form is available online here.
- The submission deadline is August 10, 2025.
- The successful honouree of the 2025 Donna Holwell Legacy Award will be chosen by several of the past honourees.
- The award will be presented during the Banquet Dinner at ORCA CON on September 10, 2025.
- The honouree(s) will be included in ORCA promotional materials regarding the award.
