The Ontario Retirement Communities Association (ORCA) applauds the introduction of the *Making Ontario Open For Business Act, 2018,* by the Ontario Government.

Our members take caring for seniors seriously.

ORCA has worked tirelessly over the last year and a half on behalf of our members and the seniors who choose to call retirement communities home. We have worked to ensure fair implementation of a higher minimum wage and new labour laws to support employees to receive fair compensation and encourage businesses to grow.

We are encouraged that the new government is listening.

And that is not right.
